## Evil Baker Doll

- black fabric for apron – 1/3 yard
- [Felt in beige and red-orange](#) (shoes and hair)
- 2 8-10" lengths of 1/4" Elastic

## Directions

The bulk of this project comes from the Cricut Girl Doll project, with a few add-ons from Playbill.

1. Load the [Girl Doll](#) project in Cricut Design Space and click “Make It.”
2. Use Design Space to cut out materials using mats 1 (white fabric), 5 (skin-color fabric), 7 (red-orange felt), 8 (brown fabric), 9 (yellow fabric), and 10 (beige felt). When cutting mat 5, do not load a fabric marker into your Maker machine—we are not using this project’s face design.

*Note: Fabric should be loaded onto a 12”x12” or 12”x24” FabricGrip Machine Mat. Felt should be loaded onto a 12”x12” StandardGrip Machine Mat.*

3. Load the [Evil Baker Doll Add-Ons](#) project in Design Space and load it onto the project canvas by clicking “Customize.”
4. [Upload and insert](#) Evil Baker Doll Add-Ons.svg onto the project canvas. Do not change the size or placement of any items.
5. Click “Make It” in the upper right-hand corner of Design Space.
6. Use Design Space to cut out materials on mat 1 (white fabric), 2 (black fabric), 3 (Everyday Iron-On, Black), 4 (Everyday Iron-On, Petal), and 5 (Everyday Iron-On, Green-Apple). When cutting Everyday Iron-On, ensure that the mat is set with [mirroring](#) on before cutting.

*Note: Fabric should be loaded onto a 12”x12” or 12”x24” FabricGrip Machine Mat. Everyday Iron-On should be loaded onto a 12”x12” StandardGrip Machine Mat.*

7. After [weeding](#) the face design and preparing it to be transferred to fabric, use Cricut’s [Heat Guide](#) to get settings and directions for attaching the face design to the doll’s face.

*Note: Use the front hair felt piece to help determine the best placement for the face design.*

8. Fold over the raw edges of the main apron piece, press, and sew to create a 1/4" hem—every edge except for the rounded bottom will be pre-cut to facilitate this.
9. Fold the strap and tie pieces in half horizontally and sew shut—the straps should be narrower than the ties. Use a sewing machine to sew the ties in place, and the straps to the upper portion of the apron—leave the other side of the straps unattached until the doll is completed.

*Note: The four rectangular pieces of black fabric are the apron's straps and ties. The ties attach to the sides of the larger and lower portion of the apron and will eventually be tied in a bow on the doll's back. The straps attach to either side of the upper portion of the apron and extend over the doll's shoulders to its back, and then attach to the lower portion of the apron, now wrapped around the doll.*

10. Using the photo of the finished doll as a guide, attach green vines to the apron according to Cricut's [Heat Guide](#). After vines are attached, the roses can be transferred on top of the vines.

*Note: There is an additional pair of vines and flowers to be attached to the back of the apron on the straps. This should be done after step 14, when the straps have been sewn to the back of the apron and cut.*

11. Use the instructions in Cricut's [Girl Doll](#) project to assemble the main doll, skipping the vest and the face embroidery. The directions for making the skirt should be used for both the upper and under skirt fabric, making two separate skirts.
12. Put the skirts on the doll, the brown skirt underneath the white.
13. Fit the apron around the doll, pinning the unsewn ends of the straps where they meet the apron panels on the doll's back.
14. Remove the apron, being careful to keep the straps pinned. Use a sewing machine to sew the straps to the apron panels where pinned, cutting off any excess afterwards.
15. Fit the completed apron around the doll, tying a bow in back.
16. Enjoy your new Broadway doll!
